

Michigan Funding Available

Completing your FAFSA will open up many funding opportunities. Once you've completed the FAFSA application, it will show which of the funding sources that you can receive on the backside of this page. Which parent to use when completing the FAFSA. To open up as much funding as possible, be sure to submit your FAFSA between October 1st and March 1st the year before attending college, and every year following while in college.

1. Student and parent creates FSA ID. Remember both IDs as this is how you will log in each year to complete the FAFSA form - <https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/personal-info>
2. Wait 1-3 days for verification.
3. Submit your FAFSA - <https://studentaid.gov/fafsa-app/ROLES>

- **IRS data exchange:** This is an electronic data service that connects your taxes to the FAFSA to help determine financial aid.
- **QUESTION HELP:** Hover over the question box and read provided instructions from FAFSA.
- **HOUSEHOLD SIZE:** Include older siblings in college if your parents still provide 50% of assistance to them.

<u>MI ECHO Scholarship</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Must have DACA, TPS, Asylum Pending, Special Immigrant Juveniles (SIJ), undocumented (meaning currently do not have lawful status in the US), or another status that prevents them from accessing federal financial aid. • Graduated with a diploma, certificate of completion, or its recognized equivalent • Must currently live in Michigan • Awards students at community college and tribal college • Must not previously earned an associate or bachelor's degree • Must enroll in an associate's degree or certificate program within six months of being accepted • December 31 application deadline 	Varies
